Dear Parish Community,

In the Battle of Britain, the Royal Air Force battled a vast, numerical superior German Air Force between July, 1940 and May, 1941, during World War II for control of the skies over England as a precursor to the German invasion of Great Britain. During the one two-week period, the Royal Air Force lost 25% of its fighter pilots. But their efforts and sacrifices forced the Germans to cancel their invasion plans and turn to day and night bombing of London futilely attempting to bring England into submission. Winston Churchill, England's war time prime minister, called the Battle of Britain its "Finest Hour."

Today, the Church celebrates its "Finest Hour," when Jesus, after his institution of the Eucharist, his suffering and death on the cross, rose from dead, body and soul, never to die again. After forty days of penance and a conversion of heart, we quickly pass through the Three Sacred Days of the Last Supper, Jesus' Passion and Death on the Cross, his Burial in the Tomb to the discovery of his empty tomb and his many appearances to his followers after his Resurrection. The Church will continue to celebrate Jesus' greatest triumph for the next fifty days before celebrating the coming of Jesus' Advocate, the Holy Spirit, and the return to "Ordinary" time, and, in popular opinion, a return to our everyday lives and busyness.

But what matters most to the Church is not so much that Christ has risen, but that Jesus is risen, that he is alive and that he has promised to rebuild his body out of living stones. That Christ has risen is probably of little importance to us after Easter Sunday is finished—like Christmas, it becomes a past event—unless Jesus could rise in me—that he is alive in me here and now. When Jesus lived here on earth, he could only be present in one place and only to so many people at one

time. But the risen, glorified Christ can be present at anytime anywhere, And Christ is not just alive in us in spirit, but fully present, body and soul, in his mystical, but real union. Saint Paul tells us: "Do you not know that all of us who were baptized in Christ Jesus, were baptized into his death? We were buried therefore with him by baptism into his death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life." (Romans 6:3ff) What would be the point of the Resurrection if we were not raised with him? The best proof that Jesus has risen is that he is still alive in us.

Christ now has no visible body other than Christians and no other love to be seen but ours. We cannot center our lives on what has occurred in the past, but on who is now present to us. How we live and breathe makes Christ alive and present here and now. Our hands become Christ's hands, our mouths speak Jesus' words of love, our hearts radiate the living love of Christ to the world. The glory of the risen Christ is that he has created a body for himself—us! We are the body of Christ! When we die to our self-centeredness and place Christ as the center of our lives, we begin to live as Christ lives and loves and the Father gives us the same Holy Spirit to animate our faith and love. "And if the Spirit who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you." (Romans 8:11) Every Sunday is a "Little Easter." Everyday of our lives should make the risen Christ alive and visible by our joyful and Spirit-filled love "**in Christ.**"
