APRIL 26, 2009 – THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear Parish Community of St. Anne,

We continue with our treatment of the new translation for the *Ordo Missae* (the Order of the Mass) in the *Roman Missal*. Last month we looked at the *Gloria* and the changes that we can expect in the new translation. Following the *Gloria* is the opening prayer. This prayer used to be called the *collect*. Although we have been praying all along, the priest invites us to a prayer that has a shift in attention: "Let us pray." After a short pause, he extends his hands and recites a prayer that *collects* "in a few short lines, all the strands of what has taken place so far, as well as the strands of our many individual thoughts [and . . .] places us all together into one succinctly expressed address to God the Father" (Driscoll, *What Happens and Mass*, 27-28). Generally, the prayer is addressed to the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit.

Following the opening prayer, of course, are the readings from Scripture, beginning the *Liturgy of the Word*. It is important to remember that there is an over-arching shape to the liturgy, as expressed in the opening prayer. Our prayers are directed to the Father, through the Son, in the Holy Spirit. So the liturgy has a two-fold movement, a Trinitarian shape. It is a movement of God toward the world and the world toward God. This is also expressed in the Liturgy of the Word: "God speaks through His Son in the Holy Spirit to the Church; and the Church responds" in the Holy Spirit, through the Son to the Father – placing Christ as mediator between heaven and earth (Driscoll, 31). We notice this played out in the liturgy itself when the God's Word is proclaimed, ending with "the Word of the Lord," and we respond, "Thanks be to God." Then the Responsorial Psalm is said or sung, and we participate by saying the antiphon, again expressing that back and forth dialogue with a Trinitarian shape between God and His Church.

God speaks to us, in human language, in his Word. This immediately points us toward the incarnation: "The Word became Flesh and dwelt among us" (John 1:14). When the Word of God is proclaimed, we are to remember all of salvation history that culminated in that event when Christ became one of us, and suffered and died for us. He fully revealed God to us in a human way who God is. He is the fullness of revelation to mankind. Although we only hear a small part of the scriptures read at each Mass, we are to remember that they are part of a whole that reflects God's intervention in human history. We remember, and in some way, those events of salvation history are made present for us in their proclamation. Besides this, we know that while God reveals himself to us, but Pope John Paul II never tired of reminding us that "Christ reveals man to himself." That is to say, we can only understand the purpose of our own existence in Christ, who is the center and fulfillment of all salvation history.

After the second reading, the *Alleluia* begins. We rise to our feet, singing that word that is so closely associated with our Lord's resurrection. The Gospel book is raised up and carried in procession. In a special way, because of the ordained minister's configuration to Christ, the Lord speaks directly through him to His Church.

You may or may not know that before the procession, if a deacon is going to proclaim the Gospel, he asks the priest, "May I have your blessing, Father." And the priest says, "May the Lord be in your heart and on your lips that you may proclaim his Gospel worthily and well, in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." And the Presider blesses him with the Sign of the Cross. If, however, there is not a deacon to proclaim the Gospel, the priest prays softly: "Cleanse my heart and my lips, almighty God, that I may worthily proclaim your holy Gospel." These words differ slightly from the original translation, but their meaning is essentially the same. They are reminiscent of Isaiah 6:5-7 when the angel of the Lord purified his lips with a burning ember so that his sins might be purged.

The ordained minister begins, "The Lord be with you." All respond, "And with your spirit." Again this change signifies that the people are not responding to the ordained minister as an individual, but to him in his sacramental role as Christ speaking to His Church. This response of the people is the only noticeable change that we will see in the liturgy of the Word up to the Creed. The ordained minister concludes with, "The Gospel of the Lord." And the people respond: "Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ." As the ordained minister kisses the book, he says softly, "Through the Words of the Gospel may our sins be wiped away."

An ordained minister proclaims the Gospel because it reminds us that "all the scriptures are read and understood under the authority of apostolic faith" (Driscoll, 51). It is for this same reason that the homily is reserved for the ordained minister as well.

The homily is meant to open our minds to the scriptures and to facilitate the community in proclaiming from their hearts that Jesus is Lord. A secondary task is to connect the Liturgy of the Word with the mystery that is about to begin, the Liturgy of the Eucharist, although the liturgy itself expresses well that "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us."

Following the homily is the Creed, and we will deal with some of the significant changes in this profession of our faith in next month's letter.
