February 15, 2009—Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Parish Community,

Several times during his pontificate, Pope John Paul II spoke about a “new evangelization.” This evangelization was not anything new in its content, but new in its energy, style and language. It was not just aimed at attracting new followers of Christ, but in renewing Catholics in their faith and relationship with God and each other.

In his encyclical, “Mission of the Redeemer,” the Holy Father said that: “No believer in Christ, no institution in the Church, can avoid this supreme duty: to proclaim Christ to all peoples.” (Redemptoris Missio, No. 3) It is the same mission that Christ entrusted to his followers before he ascended into heaven: “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit and teaching them to observe all that I have commanded.” (Matthew 28:19-20)

In essence, evangelization is the responsibility of every Christian and its goal is directed toward believer and unbeliever alike. Evangelization occurs when we give witness by words and deeds. It is primarily the work of the Holy Spirit alive in the baptized followers of Jesus. As Saint Paul writes: “But how can they call upon him in whom they have not believed? And how can they believe unless they have heard of him? And how can they hear unless there is someone to preach?...Faith then comes through hearing, and what is heard is the word of Christ.” (Romans 10:14,17) But in order to bring others to Christ, we must first confront ourselves with the reality of our own relationship with Christ and his Body, the Church.

In a short time, we and the Church will once again enter into the Lenten season. In the early part of Lent, the

Lenten scripture readings will call us to a life of Gospel conversion. They will speak to us of beginning anew; of fasting; prayer and almsgiving; of conversion; of mutual forgiveness; of hardness of heart; of love of enemies; of love and justice over ritual and cult; and of the call to holiness. One of the best ways to prepare ourselves for a change of heart and at the same time to become evangelizers to each other, is our parish Lenten study groups. “Where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them.”

As one parishioner put it: “Coming together in faith sometimes feels as though we have been wandering in the desert of today’s material world and suddenly come upon an oasis where we can for a moment of peace pray together, to give thanks and speak for those we love.” It brings to mind rest and refreshment. Today’s fears, concerns and the constant bombardment of issues and responsibilities program us away from spiritual life. By taking an hour and a half each week praying, reflecting upon and sharing our own faith and experiences in the light of the Sunday scripture readings, we can do what Jesus told his weary disciples to do—“Come by yourselves to an out-of-the-way place and rest a little.” “Come to me, all you who find life burdensome and I will refresh you. Take my yoke upon your shoulders and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble of heart. Your souls will find rest, for my yoke is easy and my burden light.” (Matthew 11:28-30) Please, this Lent, **Come** away and rest a little with the Lord and his family.
