JUNE 14, 2009—THE MOST HOLY BODY & BLOOD OF CHRIST

Dear Parish Community,

We are all familiar with the story of Jesus sending his apostles out two by two in the Sixth Chapter of Saint Matthew on their first mission: “Jesus summoned the Twelve and began sending them out two by two, giving them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing on the journey but a walking stick—no food, no traveling bag, not a coin in the purses in their belts....With that, they went off, preaching the need of repentance. They expelled many demons, anointed the sick with oil, and worked many cures.”

Later, “The apostles returned to Jesus and reported to him all that they had done and what they had taught. He said to them, ‘Come by yourselves to an out-of-the-way place and rest a little.’ People were coming and going in great numbers, making it impossible for them to so much as eat. So Jesus and the apostles went off in a boat by themselves to a deserted place.” (Matthew 6:7-8, 12-13, 30-32)

Jesus knew what his very excited and overwhelmed disciples needed after a very busy and exciting journey—rest and solitude, because he himself often had “no place to lay his head.” We allow ourselves from childhood to become overwhelmed with busyness and constant activity at the expense of allowing for much-needed rest for our bodies and quiet time for our minds and souls. If we do not stop, look and listen for a few minutes or an hour each day, we will never find God or ourselves in this lifetime. We seem enslaved to fast tracking our lives, afraid to stop lest we fall flat on our faces. A few years ago, a U.S. survey was taken of people to determine what they most feared in life—silence ranked second to first place, fear of death.

The Chinese teacher Wu Ch’eng-en, once humorously confessed: “If it were just a matter of playing football with the firm-

ment, stirring up the ocean, turning back rivers, carrying away mountains, seizing the moon, moving the Pole-star or shifting a planet, I could manage it easily enough. But if it comes to sitting still and meditating, I am bound to come off badly. It’s quite against my nature to sit still.”

Yet Matthew Kelly, a renowned speaker and writer, observed that “noise is the mouthpiece of the world. Silence is the mouthpiece of God.” It is when we cause ourselves to be quiet and listen that we come to experience God and know ourselves—for better or for worse. Silence introduces us to ourselves—our faults, failings, flaws, defects, and also our talents, abilities and potential. Silence convicts, challenges, suggests, but it also consoles, heals, comforts, clears our minds and gives courage to a weary heart. But it also introduces us to God—his love, his greatness and his faithfulness to us. It is these two discoveries that remind us of our call to discipleship. Seeing ourselves as we really are, and God as He is, challenge us to change, to grow, and to become more like God. It is during these times of silence that the Spirit empowers me to do God’s and my work. So let us accept the challenge of God to stop and make time for God and ourselves whether it be a visit to the Blessed Sacrament, a special, quiet place in my home or room, a retreat or reading the Gospels and Psalms, so that we might find that “quiet out-of-the-way place” to be with God and “Be still!—It is God who speaks!” (Psalm 46:11) For “Silence is not the absence of something; it is the presence of God.”

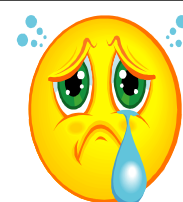
