# JUNE 7, 2009—THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

Dear Parish Community,

Lance Elko, editor of USAirways Magazine (I did a little traveling last week), noted that twenty years ago, computers with 4MB of RAM were considered powerful. The Apple Macintosh SE/30 was introduced in 1989 with just that capacity. The cost \$6,500. Today you can buy an iMac 4GB of RAM (an increase of 100,000 per cent) for about \$1,500. Much has happened since then. Technology is now traveling at warp speed. When the Net became a new universe for the whole world less than ten years ago, hundreds of new technologies were born.

Last fall, the Columbia Journalism Review published an article about the results of an Associated Press study on young adult news consumption. Young people, they learned, were overcome with “news fatigue” (i.e. overload). The article stated that we now produce far more information than we can possibly manage, let alone absorb. The Associated Press study was held in 2007 and since then the Web content has multiplied dramatically. The Journalism Review article estimated that Web sites are expanding at the rate of ten thousand an hour. Last year, it was estimated that there are 150 million existing web sites and 70 million blogs.

A new term in keeping with this rapidly expanding cyberspace universe is the “exabyte.” The prefix “exa” describes one billion billion. I’m not sure if the prefix came along with computer technological developments of the presidential stimulus packages. Like the expanding, developing computer universe and information explosion, the number for an exabyte is 1,152,921,504,606,846,976 bytes. Five exabytes, in plain language, is roughly equivalent to the amount in content in 37,000 Libraries of Congress. In 2006, we humans produced 161 exabytes of digital data.

Such staggering numbers are like the stars in the sky, our minds are very, very small in relation to the expanding digital information universe around us. Our minds shut down rather rapidly just trying to comprehend this. So, in order to save ourselves and the world as well, we need to cut back on our quest to know everything lest we become overwhelmed by too much information, and focus instead on what is really important and necessary in our lives and allow the “computers” God gave us time to study, reflect upon and act on those ideas and virtues that give meaning and direction in our lives. One needs to exercise control and good common sense in seeking information with a purpose lest one become saturated and overwhelmed by too much information leading to confusion and the loss of a sense of direction and personal relationships in life.

If one can free oneself from slavery to computer screens, cell phones and text messaging for brief spans of time, one will soon discover a whole new universe out there composed of real people and face-to-face personal relationships, mountains and forests, rivers and lakes, places to visit, interesting people to meet, challenges to be met and personal growth to take place. And in the inner space of our hearts and minds, there is a God to be found and people to be loved and helped. Although cyberspace can be a powerful tool in reaching out to the unchurched and the alienated, argumentation and knowledge have their limits. It is not just in work, but in deed that others will come to know and experience God...in us.
