MAY 17, 2009—SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear Parish Community,

Last week it was jointly announced at our three parishes and at Saint Paul parish in Saint Paul, Oregon, that I will soon be appointed the new, but old, pastor of Saint Paul. I say "new, but old," because 20 years ago I was the pastor of Saint Paul for a year before present pastor, Fr. Charles Borho, succeeded me. I took over the parish after a newly appointed pastor became sick and there was no other priest available to take his place. In addition to Saint Paul, I was archdiocesan chancellor and vicar of health and social services in addition to being chaplain at Marylhurst, the provincial house of the Holy Names Sisters. Some things never change. The year was 1988-89, a very important date in the history of the Archdiocese of Oregon City (later, Portland). Saint Paul celebrated its 150th year.

On January 6, 1839, the Feast of the Epiphany, Father (later, Archbishop) Francis Norbert Blanchet celebrated the first Mass in Oregon at Saint Paul for the French Canadian settlers living in the area later called "French Prairie," in a little log church, the first Catholic church and parish in Oregon. His nephew, Fr. Francis Xavier Blanchet, was the founding pastor of Saint Patrick of the Forest Mission in Allen Gulch, later moved to Cave Junction, in 1864, while pastor of Saint Joseph church in Jacksonville. Both priests are buried in the "new cemetery" in Saint Paul. Saint Paul parish is 170 years old. It is located 20 miles due north from Salem, about 10 miles west of I-5. Most of the families are Catholic. It also has a small school, the oldest Catholic grade school in the state.

My first visit to Saint Paul was very auspicious—I was accompanied by the then Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop, later Cardinal, Pio Laghi, to the United States, who was attending

the nearby (30 miles) centennial celebration of Mount Angel Seminary and wanted to see where the Catholic Church in Oregon began. The difficulty was that although I knew a lot of the history of Saint Paul, I had never actually been there. Fortunately, Fr. Bruno Becker, OSB, had been assigned as host to the archbishop and had some idea as to how to get to Saint Paul, having grown up in nearby Woodburn where Fr. Angel Perez is now gloriously reigning as Saint Luke's beloved pastor. It had been sometime since Fr. Bruno had visited Saint Paul. Fortunately, we guessed all the right roads and went directly to Saint Paul where the local historian of Saint Paul, Joe McKay, met us and took us on a grand tour of Oregon's early church history. So much for "my early history" and experience of Saint Paul.

The church itself, the oldest standing building in Oregon built in 1846 from bricks fired from pits behind the church was badly damaged in the "Mount Angel" earthquake. A fragile wooden infrastructure kept the church from disintegrating and the church was dismantled and rebuilt. The only innovation—-church restrooms.

Although the official move is to take place July 1, the Saint Paul pastor told me he has permission to remain another week until July 8, after the famous Saint Paul rodeo. And, he isn't moving his things out until his move. Hopefully, the new Saint Anne pastor doesn't have as much as I have. I hope to slow down a bit and begin for the first time in my life to start the first landfill in Saint Paul.
