# MAY 24, 2009—SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Dear Parish Community,

Catholics are accustomed to ritual prayer and praying with the whole community. Many Catholics are uncomfortable when someone just breaks out in prayer while many of our evangelical brothers and sisters are accustomed to do so. Spontaneous, open prayer for a person is a rare occurrence for most Catholics. It simply has not been part of our tradition.

Because public prayer for Catholics is usually in the form of common, memorized prayers such as the "Hail, Mary" or "Bless us, O Lord," before meals, private prayer becomes much more personal and intimate. Two people praying together can be extremely intimate, as in a prayer of husband and wife, and thus it can make some people uncomfortable.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus, praying alone in the Garden of Gethsemani the night before he was to die, Luke tells us that Jesus "was in such agony and he prayed so fervently that his sweat became like drops of blood falling on the ground" and that Jesus begged his Father to take his "cup" of suffering away. We do not find this prayer in John's Gospel. Instead, Jesus prays at the end of the Supper while still in the Upper Room with his disciples.

Unlike our prayer, which tends to be silent, Jewish prayer was said aloud. For a prayer to have power, it had to be truly spoken, not thought. So Jesus prayed, but in John, Jesus does not pray for himself and the agony he is about to endure. In John's Gospel, Jesus prays for his disciples that they will be able to endure. It is an intimate prayer that expresses Jesus' intimacy with the Father and his deep, abiding love for his disciples. Jesus' prayer is very intimate and special, because He is about to die.

When death is imminent, the important things come into focus. Last January, in the minutes after a US Air jetliner lost both engines and began plummeting toward a crash landing in the Hudson River, one of the passengers scribbled a note on the back of his business card. He wrote to his family telling them, "I love you." After the miraculous landing, he was able to hand deliver his message.

Lloyd Chamberlain, the onetime prime minister of Great Britain, was facing a dangerous triple-bypass heart operation. Before leaving home for the hospital, he gave his wife his wedding ring. He also put his absentee ballot for the election of a new prime minister in the mail. Lloyd died after 11 hours on the operating table, but the absentee ballot made it, having been post-marked before he died. In Jesus' time, people did not leave writ-

ten wills, but handed them down orally to their heirs.

Jesus' prayer in John's Gospel at the Last Supper is called his "priestly prayer," Jesus prays that his disciples and all believers might share in the intimacy that Jesus shared with his Father and with his disciples. In his prayer, Jesus referred to his earthly ministry as a thing of the past. Jesus was about to return to the Father in whose glory he shared, and now he was concerned about those who would continue his work and ministry after he had ascended to the Father.

Jesus first prayed for his disciples. It is clear in his prayer that victory over sin and evil has been achieved, but the working out of that victory will be the mission of his disciples. Aware that belonging to him would set them in opposition to the world, just as he had been, Jesus prayed fervently for their protection. Just as their relationship with Jesus and each other had protected them during Jesus' earthly ministry, so would the Holy Spirit continue to guard them after Jesus had passed from death to life.

Jesus' second petition was for the joy of his disciples. Joy is something both precious and elusive. Joy is precious because moments of joy tend to remain in our memories. Joy is also elusive when we look for it in the wrong places—money, sex, fame, power. If, however, we dare to follow Jesus, living in his love and loving as he did, seeking the happiness of others rather than our own happiness, we will find the joy that Jesus promises.

Jesus' third petition in his priestly prayer is that his disciples might be consecrated in the truth. "Consecration" means to be anointed and set apart for sacred purpose, not in the manner of kings whose anointing set them apart from ordinary people, but in the truth, which immerses his followers into the heart of the struggles of all their fellow human beings in the world. Jesus was anointed on his feet by Mary at Bethany in preparation for his death and burial. Jesus anointed the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper, strengthening them to face hostility and hatred from the world that gives way to the joy of being loved and loving Jesus in this life.

Every word of Jesus' priestly prayer before his death and resurrection is a reminder that He is praying for us, you and me. He prays for our efforts to live the Gospel. He prays that we might live in holy joy and speak the truth with our words and our lives.
