March 29, 2009—Fifth Sunday of Lent

Dear Parish Community,

This letter will continue our treatment of the new translation for the *Ordo Missae* (the Order of the Mass) in the *Roman Missal*. This month we will look at the *Gloria*. You will probably notice that there are some small changes from the translation to which we are accustomed. Here is the complete Gloria (please note that I have included corresponding Scriptural references):

Glory to God in the highest, and on Earth peace to people of good will [Luke 2:14]. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son [Acts 13:33, Heb. 1:5; 5:5], Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world [John 1:29], have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father [Matt. 26:64, Heb. 8:1], have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One [Rev. 15:4], you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High [Ps. 83:19], Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

First you will notice that we proclaim God's glory in the words of the angels on the night of Christ's birth. We notice a slight difference from what we are used to: instead of "peace to his people on earth," the new text says, "peace to people of good will." This corresponds more closely to the Latin: "*pax hominibus bonae voluntatis*." This little Latin phrase corresponds very closely to the *Latin Vulgate Bible*. This variation in the text seems to me to imply that God's peace is not an automatic given to all people of the Earth, but that it comes to those who are people of good will – those who are really trying to do the will of God in their lives.

Next we notice a change in the order of the text from the one to which we are used. Instead of "Lord God, heavenly King, almighty God and Father" being at the beginning of these things

that we owe to God, it is placed at the end of the sentence. This change of word order, too, corresponds more closely to the original Latin text.

Also, no longer will we say, "we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory," but, instead, "We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your *great* glory . . ." Here again, we have, in my estimation, an improvement which corresponds to the original Latin text. For it is a joyful hymn; we can detect a rhythm in the text which pushes us forward to make our *great* and *glorious* God "all in all" (1 Cor. 15:28), who alone is deserving of our total worship.

The rest of *Gloria* is much the same except instead of "only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God," the new version has "Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father." This "Only Begotten" corresponds to the Latin, "*unigénite*." Also there is an extra "have mercy on us" (we need all the mercy we can get) and an extra "you take away the sins of the world" in the new version. These changes, too, correspond more closely to the Latin text.

Then the *Gloria* ends with the Trinitarian formula. It is as if this hymn immerses us, right at the start, in that Trinitarian communion of love that is God's very being. Fr. Driscoll writes in his book, *What Happens at Mass*, that in "Advent and Lent we abstain from singing this hymn so that it can ring out with fresh vigor on the feasts for which these seasons prepare us." It is so fitting that we sing/say this beautiful hymn on those big feast days and Sundays, so that we are reminded of the greatness of our God and the mercy he bestows on his people.
