November 8, 2009— THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Parishioners,

I was reminded once again from the homily Fr. Bill gave 2 weeks ago that my job title is not the “Youth Minister,” but rather the “Coordinator of Youth Ministry”. I was also reminded of this in the extraordinary support the youth received when participating at Mass. Those who served as Eucharistic Ministers were not trained by me, but by others. Our lector received instruction and advice from other lectors. The choir learned at rehearsal from those who have been singing at Mass for many years.

Who is a parent or grandparent? Who is an aunt or uncle? Or even a friend? If you know anyone under the age of 18, **YOU** are a youth minister, with a special call to bring those you know closer to God. We as a parish community are called to encourage the participation, the questions, the hope and the energy of our young people, and to show them ways that they can also serve.

Youth Ministry should not simply be youth group once a week, removing our youth from the public eye and letting them “do their own thing.” Rather, it should be a comprehensive, parish-wide effort to encourage and strengthen our youth to be active members of the community, and to participate at all levels of parish life.

I want to especially thank those of you who helped prepare our youth to serve at Mass, and to encourage all of our parishioners to think and pray about what you might do to help bring youth into our community of faith. We are looking to build our core team; if you feel called to this ministry. I would love to meet with you to talk about what gifts God has given you for youth ministry.
