Dear Parishioners,

The budgeting for next year is nearly done and I want to begin by thanking everyone for their financial generosity to the parish as it makes all our ministries possible. In the budgeting process, we are expecting no change in our income for the following fiscal year (July 1, 2010-June 30, 2011). You may remember that in order to balance our current budget, most of our employees' hours were cut. As such, we expect to end this year in the black, something that has not happened in several years.

In order to balance the budget for this coming year, I along with the budget committee from the Administrative Council had to determine how to offer as many services as possible while also balancing the budget. Reflecting on a personnel review done two years previously by the Archdiocese as well as collective thinking with the budget committee as to ways to solve the financial issue, I have concluded that we need to reorganize our administrative staff and augment our pastoral staff.

As we journey towards July 1st, our new fiscal year, we are eliminating one secretarial position. That means that most services that have been offered from the Parish Center will be offered from the main office. In addition, we are looking to close the main office one day a week, likely Fridays, but that is not certain yet. One concern we have is the security and availability of the Parish Center. At this time, we have no plans to close the Parish Center and lock all the doors to prevent people from using it. On the contrary, our hope is to keep it available for parishioners to use. However, once the new school year starts the end of August, we may have to consider some limited access during the day in order to ensure adequate safeguards for our school children. How we will do this is still in process. Your ideas are, of course welcome.

As the pastor, it is my duty to make sure that we are using the funds donated in the best way possible. I hope that my transparency adds to your confidence in this regard. I am committed to offering dynamic ministries while at the same time being fiscally responsible. The bottom line is that we cannot continue to use our savings to balance our budgets as we have for so many years. I am very proud to tell you that this past year, the school, the parish and both mission churches all operated with balanced budgets, and I am committed to continue that into the future.

These changes and probable further reduction in administrative assistance will undoubtedly come as very sad news to many, but I believe that God has plans for us to thrive. For the moment, we need to tighten our belts. I have hope that God will inspire people to get more involved. There are many things we can do that only require the volunteering of one's gifts. Please consider how you can share your gifts of time, talent, and treasure. No matter what our budget, we will continue to be a welcoming community, inspired by the Holy Spirit, seeking to proclaim Christ's loving mission (Parish Mission Statement).

Current paid Catholic Sentinel subscribers, and those who prefer home delivery, may continue to have the newspaper mailed to their home, at an annual cost of \$25. Current pre-paid customers will have their subscriptions extended so they receive the 51 promised issues. The current Sentinel is presented in a 16 page format. Under the new plan, the newspaper will increase the total number of pages. Look for new features and discussion by church experts on various topics of the day.

Joy from knowing I am following God's plan, and Joy for new experiences, new learning and new ways to serve. Sadness in that I have to leave St. Anne, this wonderful loving community that has been my home for 3 years. It's hard to believe that I've only been here that long, as you all treat me as if I've always been here and have always been a much loved son of the parish. I ask and pray that you show the same love and support for St. Anne's next coordinator of youth ministry, and continue to show that love and support to the youth of our parish.

## OFFERTORY COLLECTION From Alan Crews, Business Manager

I will update you again next week concerning our offertory status; however, in the meantime, I will try to explain a bit more about our budget issues this year and the concerns for next year with reference to Father Bill's letter this week. As you might expect, personnel costs make up the largest portion of our total expenses, or about 58% for this year. While salaries and wages have actually **decreased 4.3%** in the past 2 years, benefits costs (primarily health insurance) have **increased 41%** in that same 2 years. Therefore, our overall personnel costs have **increased 7.9%** over the past 2 years. Services to parishioners and educational expenses account for 18% of our expenses, and those expenses have **increased 11%** just this past year. Archdiocesan assessments continue to be pegged at 8% of our total offertory, however, those expenses are **4% higher** than 1 year ago because of our notable improvement in offertory received for the 2007-08 fiscal year ending June 30, 2008. Finally our utility costs consume almost 7% of our expenses, and they are **3.5% higher** than last year.

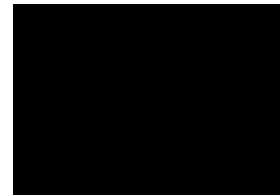
