Dear Parishioners,

History was made on Saturday, May 29th, 2010, in Washington, DC for the Catholic Church in America and Nigeria, when six Nigerians were ordained Catholic Priests for the service to the universal Church especially to the African Americans. These men were ordained for St. Joseph’s Society of the Sacred Heart (The Josephites). The Josephites main mission is the evangelization in the African American community. The ordination took place at Holy Comforter, St. Cyprian Church, Washington, DC. Most Rev. John H. Ricard, S.S.J., Bishop of Pensacola-Tallahassee, was the ordaining prelate. The auxiliary Bishop of Washington, DC, Bishop Martin Holley, who ordained them as deacons last year, and more than 100 priests concelebrated the Mass. The occasion was memorable and a wonderful reunion for all, especially priests serving in different states and dioceses of this great nation and beyond. Guess what, I had the honor and privilege of witnessing this awesome and historical event.

Before the ordination, I visited the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception and the Franciscan Monastery. This majestic church (Basilica) is not only renowned for its beautiful sacred art, but also for its unique architecture and richness in Catholic and American culture. What struck me greatly about the Basilica was the different side altars at the upper Church and the crypt level with different statues and images of our Blessed Mother.

The visit to the Franciscan Monastery (The Holy Land Of America) located at 1400 Quincy St., NE, brought back many sweet memories of my pilgrimage to the Holy Land five years ago, because it offered me the chance to see the replicas of the famous Holy Land Shrines. It also reminds me of the Franciscan’s work and the importance of Holy Land’s preservation. The Franciscan Monastery is a good and inspiring place to visit when in Washington, DC; for they say that “a visit to Washington, DC will be complete with a trip to the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land.”

On Sunday the newly ordained priests celebrated their first Mass together. After the general one, we moved to St. Anthony of Padua Church, Baltimore, Maryland, where one of them, Rev. Kenneth Ugwu, S.S.J., from my home diocese (Orlu) celebrated Mass for the Nigeria Igbo Catholic Community. The Mass including the songs were all in Igbo language. It was a “home” far away from home. Finally, I thank you for your prayers and support, especially those who made this historical trip a great success. I owe you my prayers.

MEDITATIONS BEFORE MASS

"He who has ears to hear, let him hear."

To have ears to hear requires grace, for God's word can be heard only by him whose ears God has opened. He does this when He pleases, and the prayer for truth is directed at that divine pleasure. But it also requires something that we ourselves desire and are capable of being *inwardly present*; listening from the vital core of our being, unfolding ourselves to that which comes from beyond, to the sacred word. All this is possible only when we are inwardly still. In stillness alone can we really hear. When we come in from the outside our ears are filled with the racket of the city, the words of those who have accompanied us, the laboring and quarreling of our own thoughts, the disquiet of our hearts' wishes and worries, hurts, and joys. How are we possibly to hear what God is saying? That we listen at all is something not everyone does. It is even better when we pay attention and make a real effort to understand what is being said. But all this is not yet that attentive stillness in which God's word can take root. This must be established before the service begins, if possible in the silence on the way to church, still better in a brief period of composure the evening before.
